





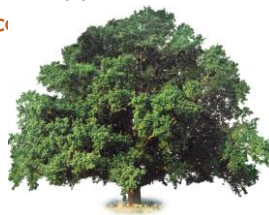
Vocabulary-	Meaning
roots	the part of the plant underground that holds the plant in the earth and takes in water and nutrients
stem	the main body of the plant that supports it
leaves	The green parts attached to the stem that make the food or plant
soils	the colourful part of a plant that contains the seeds
travel	to make a journey
disperse	to spread over a wide area
spread	to extend over a large area
pod	like a case or a vessel that holds in the seeds
seed	the unit or part that develops into a plant
crops	a plant that is grown on a large scale
pest	an insect that attacks crops
harvest	period of gathering crops
weed	a wild plant growing where it is not wanted
vine	a climbing plant
needle	a pointed leaf of a plant

Key knowledge – How are seeds dispersed?

Some seeds are transported by wind, and have seeds that are made to glide, float or spin through the air.	Plants growing near a river may use the flowing water to transport their seeds.	Many plants use animals to carry seeds around they do this by sticking to their fur or by being part of a tasty fruit which they eat.	Some seeds are made to explode and throw the seeds a good distance from the plant.

Key knowledge – What are the two types of trees?

A deciduous tree is a tree that sheds its leaves each year. In autumn, the leaves usually change colour and fall off. This happens when the weather gets cold.



Evergreen tree is a tree which stays green all year round.
