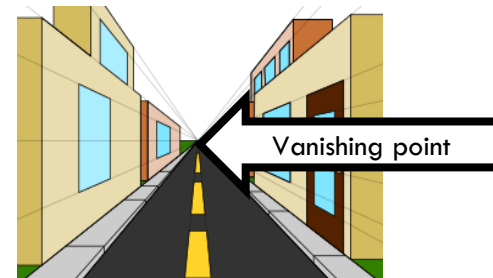


Vocabulary	Meaning
foreground	The part of a view that is nearest to the observer
line	lines can be vertical, horizontal, diagonal, or curved. They can be any width or texture
urban	in, relating to, or characteristics of a town or city
parallel	side by side and having the same distance continuously between them
three dimensional	solid rather than flat, because it can be measured in three directions
converge	tend to meet at a point
aerial perspective	the technique of representing more distant objects as fainter and more blue
receding	go or move back or further away from a previous position
definition	distinctness in the outline of an object, image, or sound/mark out of the boundary or limits of
foreground	the part of a view that is nearest to the observer
palette	the range of colours used by a particular artist or in a particular picture
figures	a person's body shape
matchstick man	a very simple drawing of a person, with lines to represent the arms, legs, and body
shape	the external form, contours, or outline of someone or something
fluid	smooth and flowing

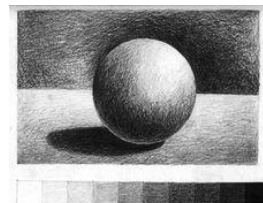
### Key knowledge – Vanishing point

A **vanishing point** is the point at which receding parallel lines viewed in **perspective** appear to **converge**



### Key knowledge – Tone and Hue

**Tone** is the light and dark values used to render a realistic object



**Hue** is colour or shade

LS Lowry is famous for his paintings of industrial and **urban** landscapes. He used **matchstick figures** in his paintings.
