Year 1 British History: Ice Age

Vocabulary	Meaning
ice sheet	a thick sheet of ice that covers a large area of land
compress	to press or squeeze together
ice stream	a corridor of fast flowing ice
island	an area of land surrounded by water
climate	weather in a place over a long time
sea levels	the point where the ocean meets the land
land bridge	a strip of land connecting two landmasses
adaptation	a special skill which helps an animal to survive and do everything it needs to do
carcass	the dead body of an animal
extinction	the dying out or disappearance of a species from earth
fossils	parts of a dead plants or animals that turned to rock over a long period of time
hunter-gatherer	a person who lives mainly by hunting and fishing wild animals, and collecting wild plants for food
nomad	a person who does not live in one home, but moves around from place to place
foraging	the act of searching for food
hearth	an area in front of a fire place
shelter	a place that gives protection against weather or danger
