

Key knowledge - Emperor Qin Shi Huangdi



Emperor Qin was a skilled leader but also a tyrant. He unified China and made vast reforms in many areas during his rule, for example, establishing a common currency & standard units of measurement. He began the construction of the Great Wall of China to protect China from invaders to the north. Daily life was harsh. Peasants were farmers or harvested silk. Anyone deemed as slow or lazy was sent to build the Wall, which measures over 13,000 miles long and is 2,300 years old. He was buried in an enormous tomb with the Terracotta Army.
