## Year 6 RE: An extraordinary baby (Incarnation)

Vocabulary	Meaning
incarnate	(especially of a deity or spirit) embodied in human form
messiah	the promised deliverer of the Jewish nation prophesied in the Hebrew Bible
incarnation	a person who embodies in the flesh a deity, spirit or quality (in Christian theology: the embodiment of God the Son in human flesh as Jesus Christ)
flesh	the soft substance consisting of muscle and fat that is found between the skin and bones of a human/animal
divine	of or like God or a god
form	the visible shape or configuration of something
embodiment	the representation or expression of something in a tangible or visible form
deity	the creator and supreme being (in Christianity)

## Key knowledge – God incarnate


Christians believe that Jesus is both God's son and God himself born in the form of a man.

Christians believe the evidence that Jesus is God incarnate is found

in stories in the **Bible**. That for **Christians** the miracles **Jesus** performed give validity to their belief that **Jesus** was **God** in human form.

The concept of Jesus as God incarnate influences how Christians behave.
