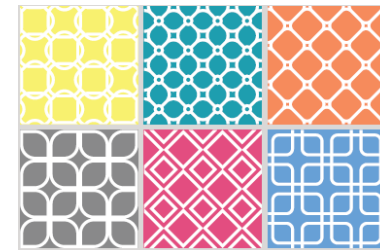


Vocabulary	Meaning
aboriginal	people who originally lived in Australia
symbol	something that stands for something else
overlapping	putting things on top of each other to cover part of the picture
repeating	do or use something again or more than once
line	a stroke made with a pen, pencil or other tool
ochre	an earthy pigment
sketch	a rough or unfinished drawing or painting
outline	a line or set of lines showing the shape of an object
texture	how something looks and feels
pattern	a repeated decorative design
technique	a way of carrying out a particular task
dotting	mark with a small spot or spots
familiar	something that is well known
X-ray	a photo of the inside of a body/something
cross hatching	shading with parallel lines
shading	a darker area of an art work
tone	how light or dark something is

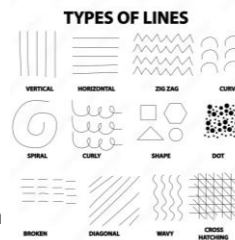
**Key knowledge – Repeated pattern**

Artists use **repeating patterns** in art by using the same lines, shapes, **symbols** and colours more than once.

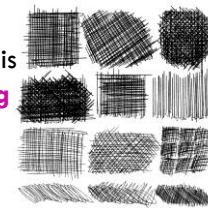


**Key knowledge – line types / cross hatching**

**Lines** can be used to show **pattern** and **texture**, there are lots of different types of **lines** you can use



**Cross hatching** is a **shading technique** using parallel lines.



**Key knowledge – Aboriginal art**

**Aboriginal** art are paintings created by **aboriginal** people. They often used Australian animals in their art. They used **ochre** mixed with water to create one of the world's first paints.
