Opinion	What you think about something
Adjust	Alter or move (something) slightly in order to achieve the desired fit
Spreadsheet	An electronic document in which data is arranged
Questionnaire	A list of questions that several people are asked
Brand	A type of product made by a company
Format	A way of arranging things
Market research	The action or activity of gathering information about consumers' needs and preferences
Subject	The thing that is being discussed
Field	A box into which text is typed
Username	The name someone uses to sign-in to a device (often their email address)
Interpret	To work out what something means
Results	Information gathered
Analyse	To examine our findings or results
Conclusion	A final summing up of your thoughts
Insert	Add something to your page (e.g.an image)
Distribute	Create a space between things
Design	A decorative pattern
Dimensions	One length, width or depth


