

Vocabulary	Meaning
theme	the main idea of a picture, talk or piece of writing
identify	establish who or what, something or someone is and where it might belong
composition	positioning the objects in a frame so the viewer's eye is drawn to the most interesting area
focal	relating to the centre or most important part
panoramic	a wide view of a large area in all directions
perspective	representing 3D objects in a 2D picture to give an idea of height, width, depth and position
portrait	an image that is taller than it is wide, it is taken vertically
landscape	an image that is wider than it is tall, it is taken horizontally
picture type	the different styles in which a picture, image or photograph is taken e.g. close up or wide shot
import	to add or include in a file into an application
enhance	intensify, increase or improve the quality or value of something
effects	an illusion created for pictures and television using computer graphics
contrast	the change of the lightest in comparison to the darkest part of an image
evaluate	to make a judgement based on opinion and experience
