invade	to enter as an enemy by force
battle	a hostile and violent meeting between two opposing sides
empire	a group of countries all ruled by one person
fort	a place that's made strong and secure enough to be defended
invader	to enter as an enemy, by force, in order to conquer
guard	to protect from danger or harm
barracks	where soldiers live for a short amount of time
civilian	a person who is not serving in the armed forces or police
amphitheatre	an oval or round building with seats rising in rows from an open, central area
hypocaust	Ancient Roman under floor heating system
atrium	a courtyard inside a building
border	the line between two countries
barbarian	a person that is believed by others to be savage, primitive or not civilized
emperor	the male ruler of an empire
aqueduct	a channel or pipe built to carry water over a long distance
sewer	a large underground pipe that carries off the liquid and solid waste
