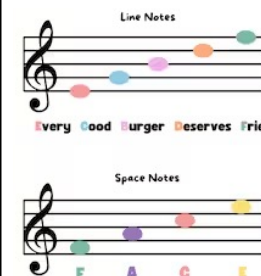


Vocabulary	Meaning
Pentatonic	Music which contains five different pitches
Scale	A set of musical notes ordered by pitch
Folk music	Music that is passed down the generations in an informal way
Voile	A thin fabric, french for veil
Impressionist	A style of music introduced in 19 th century France, linked to impressionist art like the works of Van Gogh
Melody	A series of notes played in order, or a tune
Notate	To write music using a system like staves on manuscript paper
Glockenspiel	A tuned percussion instrument with metal bars
Tempo	The speed of the music
Mood	How the music feels
Rest	A pause or break in a piece of music
Motif	A small musical idea or theme
Crescendo	To gradually increase the dynamic
Fortissimo	Very loud
Pianissimo	Very quiet
Texture	The layers of sound within a piece of music
Timbre	The quality of the sound, or how we describe the sound

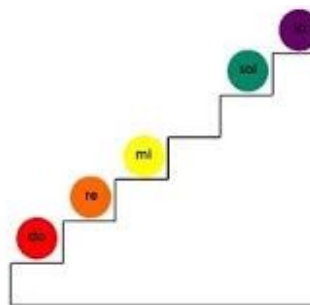
Key knowledge - How did impressionism influence music?



Like in art, impressionism was a period of change in music

Impressionist music conveys more subtle emotion. Composers 'painted' sounds using rich harmonies and textures, experimenting with different scales, commonly the pentatonic.

Key knowledge - What is the pentatonic scale?



The pentatonic scale is a series of five pitches.

It is used in many folk traditions across the world. It moves in step, skipping from 'Mi' to 'So'
