

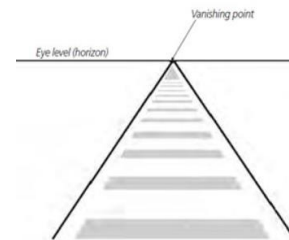
Vocabulary	Meaning
front elevation	shows the front of a house as you would see it, if you were standing in front of it
side elevation	the view from the side of
plan view	the appearance of an object as seen from above
architect	a person who designs buildings
representation	showing someone or something in a particular way
horizontal	parallel to the surface of the earth or to the horizon
vertical	a line that rises straight up and down
vanishing point	the point at which something that has been decreasing disappears altogether
depth	the distance from top to bottom or from front to back
converge	to move toward or meet at a common point
parallel	lines side by side and having the same distance continuously between them
recedes	go or move back or further away from a previous position
linear	arranged in or extending along a straight or nearly straight line

Key knowledge – Perspective

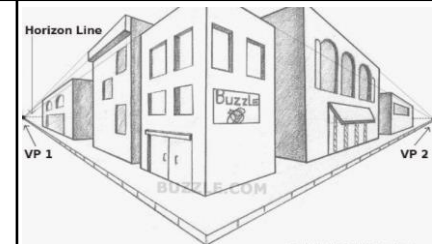
Perspective is an art technique that creates an illusion of three-dimensions (depth and space) on a two-dimensional (flat) surface. It is what makes a painting seem and look real.



Key knowledge – different types of perspective



One point perspective is a type of perspective that uses a single vanishing point to create the illusion of depth in a work of art. We are going to be drawing a building today.



Two point perspective is used for drawing buildings or interiors. Two point perspective uses two vanishing points placed on the horizon line.
